



Keeping Your Cavapoo Safe & Happy

Our Cavapoos are part of the family, and their safety is our top priority.
Use this chart to keep your home a safe place for your furry friend.

HARMFUL ITEM	WHY IT'S DANGEROUS	HOME REMEDIES (WHEN APPROPRIATE)	WHEN TO CALL THE VET
 Chocolate (All types)	Contains theobromine which can cause vomiting, diarrhea, increased heart rate, tremors, seizures and even death.	- If eaten in small amounts, give a small amount of hydrogen peroxide (1 tsp per 10 lbs) to induce vomiting (only if dog is alert). - Offer water.	Call the vet immediately if your dog ate any amount of chocolate, especially dark chocolate or baking chocolate.
 Grapes & Raisins	Can cause sudden kidney failure, which can be fatal.	- If eaten recently, induce vomiting (see above). - Offer water and monitor.	Call the vet immediately. Even a small amount can be dangerous.
 Onions, Garlic, Chives, Leeks	Can damage red blood cells and cause anemia.	- No home remedy is effective. - Monitor for symptoms.	Call the vet right away if your dog ate any of these foods.
 Avocado	Contains persin which can cause vomiting, diarrhea and heart problems.	- Remove any remaining avocado. - Offer water.	Call the vet if your dog ate the skin, pit or a large amount of avocado.
 Caffeine (Coffee, Tea, Energy Drinks)	Can cause restlessness, rapid breathing, tremors, seizures and heart problems.	- Offer water. - Keep your dog calm and quiet.	Call the vet immediately if your dog shows any symptoms.
 Alcohol	Can cause vomiting, diarrhea, lack of coordination, difficulty breathing, coma or death.	- No home remedy is effective. - Keep your dog warm and calm.	Call the vet immediately. Alcohol poisoning is a medical emergency.
 Medications (Human or Pet)	Many medications can be toxic, even in small amounts.	- Do not induce vomiting unless directed by a vet. - Bring the packaging with you.	Call the vet immediately. Different medications require different treatments.
 Cleaning Products	Can cause burns, drooling, vomiting, diarrhea and respiratory distress.	- Rinse mouth with water if safe to do so. - Offer small sips of water.	Call the vet if your dog shows any signs of poisoning or ingested a large amount.
 Essential Oils	Can cause drooling, vomiting, weakness, tremors and difficulty breathing.	- Remove from the area. - Offer water.	Call the vet if your dog was exposed to a large amount or shows symptoms.
 Batteries	Can cause burns, mouth ulcers and internal bleeding if swallowed.	- Do not induce vomiting. - Offer small sips of water if able.	Call the vet immediately. Battery ingestion is a serious emergency.
 Xylitol (Sugar-Free Gum, Candy, Mints, Peanut Butter)	Causes a rapid release of insulin leading to low blood sugar, seizures, liver failure and death.	- If eaten, give a small amount of honey or Karo syrup on gums (only if dog is alert). - Offer water.	Call the vet immediately. Xylitol poisoning is a medical emergency.
 Houseplants (Lilies, Sago Palm, Pothos, Dieffenbachia, Philodendron, etc.)	Many plants are toxic and can cause vomiting, drooling, diarrhea, tremors or kidney failure.	- Remove any plant material from mouth. - Offer water.	Call the vet to identify the plant and get guidance based on the type and amount ingested.
 Trash & Counter Surfing	Trash can contain harmful foods, bones, wrappers, medications and more.	- Remove access to trash. - Monitor your dog closely.	Call the vet if your dog ate something harmful or shows symptoms.
 Raw Dough (Yeast Dough)	Dough can expand in the stomach and the yeast can produce alcohol.	- No home remedy is effective. - Keep your dog calm.	Call the vet immediately. This can be life-threatening.
 Macadamia Nuts	Can cause vomiting, weakness, lethargy, tremors and elevated body temperature.	- No home remedy is effective. - Offer water.	Call the vet if your dog ate any amount of macadamia nuts or shows symptoms.
